## **ORDINANCE NO. 5387**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9.1 OF THE "UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES," EDITION OF 2022, AS ADOPTED BY THE CITY OF LINDSBORG, KANSAS.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF LINDSBORG, KANSAS:

**WHEREAS**, the City of Lindsborg, Kansas regulates its public offenses within its corporate limits by incorporating by reference the "Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities", edition of 2022.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Lindsborg desires to amend the public offense of Disorderly Conduct to better serve its citizens and the needs of its law enforcement.

**SECTION 1:** Section 9.1 of the "Uniform Public offense Code for Kansas Cities", edition of 2022, as adopted by the City of Lindsborg, Kansas in Ordinance No. 5387, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 9.1. Disorderly Conduct.

- a) Disorderly conduct is one or more of the following acts that the person knows or should know will alarm, anger, or disturb others or provoke an assault or other breach of the peace:
  - 1) brawling or fighting;
  - 2) disturbing an assembly, meeting or procession, not lawful in its character;
  - 3) using fighting words or engaging in noisy conduct tending reasonably to around alarm, anger, or resentment in others; and
  - 4) willfully throwing, depositing, or placing any substance upon any property in which another has an interest without the consent of such other person, when such action does not constitute criminal damage to property.
- (b) Disorderly conduct is a Class C violation. (K.S.A. 21-6203).

**SECTION 2:** All prior ordinances in conflict with Section 9.1, as revised in Section 1 above, are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3:** This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the official City newspaper.
